- Please take time and add to this list with thoughtfulness.

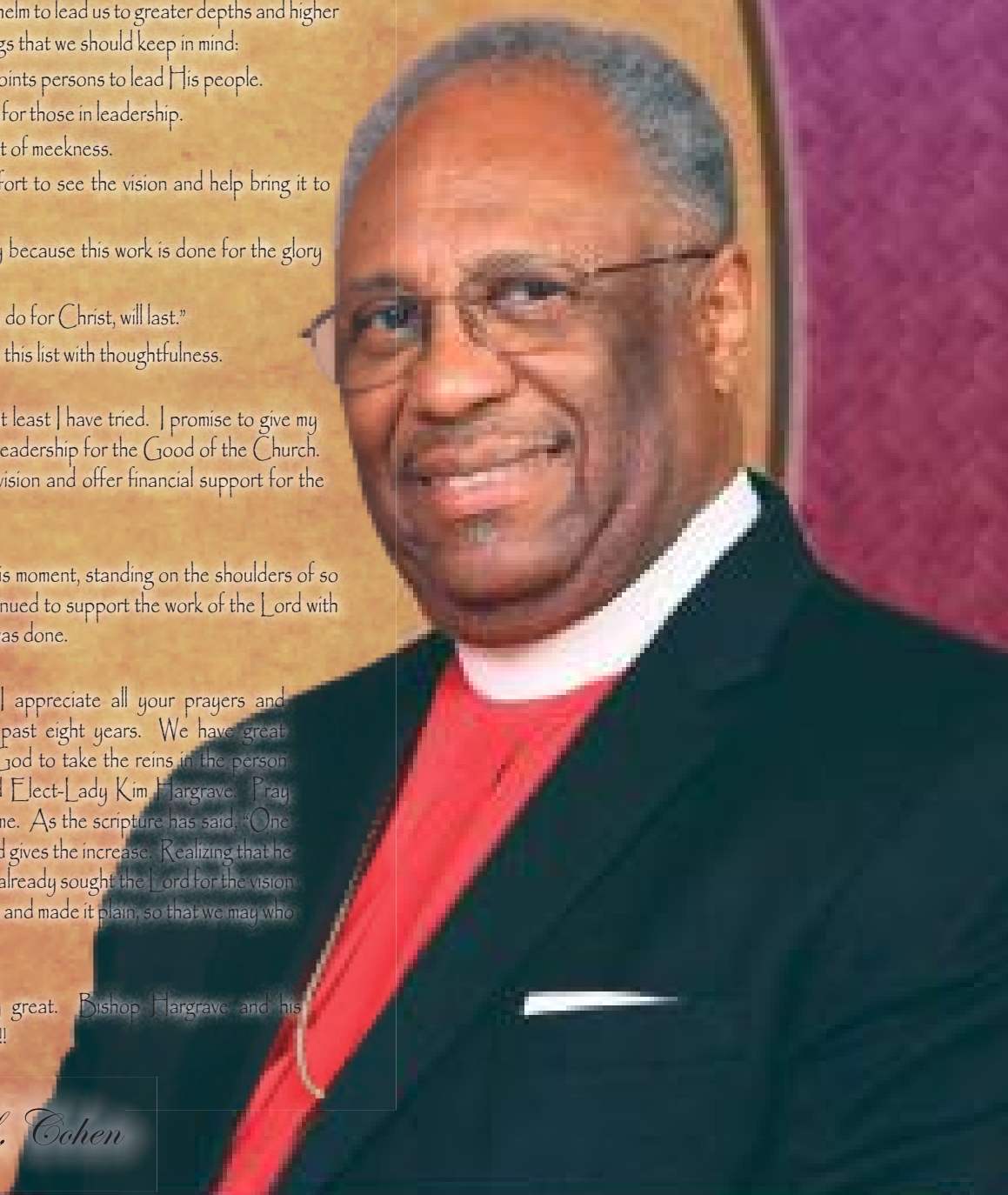

THE EDITOR'S BRIEF

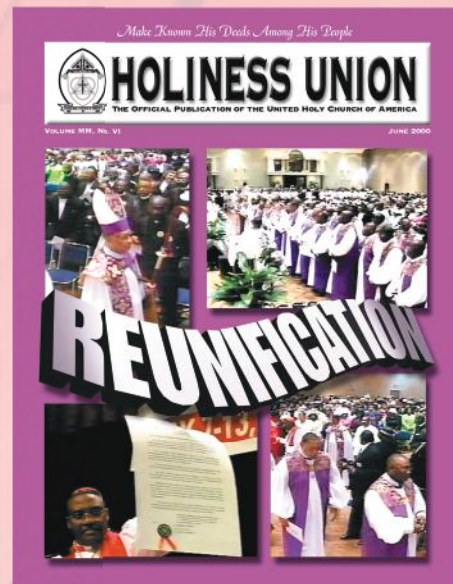

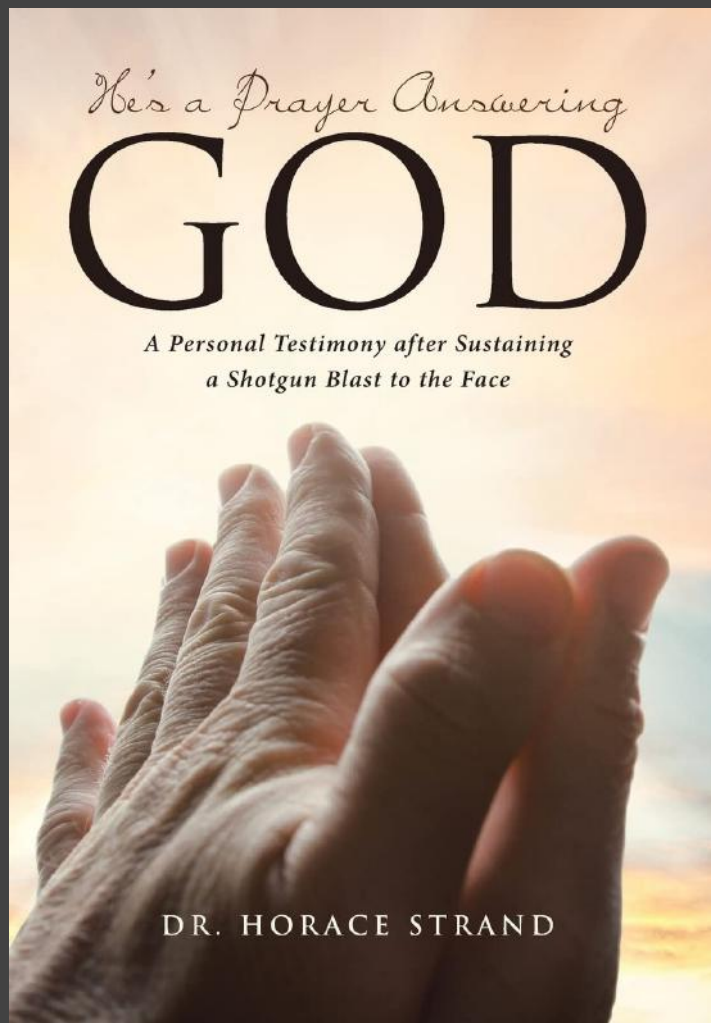

Remembering the Life & Legacy of Bishop Bose Bradford

The Right Reverend Bishop Bose Bradford, a Prophetic Voice was silenced on this earth, a Voice that gave the earth Grace and Mercy, a voice that rung out with Patience and great Love, known as the Proclaimer of the Gospel, one who was not ashamed to Preach the gospel, who was committed and faithful to the gospel for over 60 years, affectionately known as “My Bishop” to those he touched with his boundless love and faith, gave up his earthly rights and departed from his Physical realm and exchanged it for His Earthly Celestial, on March 15, 2024. Born on February 10, 1936, in the humble town of Oakland, Mississippi, he was an inspiration of light and hope, guiding his flock with a gentle hand and a heart brimming with God’s love.

Bishop Bose Bradford was born to the holy union of the late Mr. Dock and Mrs. Estelle Bradford, who instilled in him the values that would become the cornerstone of his life’s work. He journeyed from Mississippi to St. Louis in 1954, where he continued his formal and college education and resided with his late brother Luss and his sister-in-law Sarah Bradford, who called him son. In 1958, at the age of 21, he experienced a life-changing spiritual transformation, receiving salvation and the Holy Ghost under the guidance of Pastor John Williams.

His dedication to service extended beyond the church as he honorably served his country as a medic in the United States Army. Upon his return, Bishop Bradford united in holy matrimony with the late Mother Ethel Faye Bradford, and their loving union was blessed with a daughter, Elaine. His commitment to his family was matched only by his devotion to his calling.

Bishop Bradford’s professional journey was marked by 28 years of dedicated service at Famous Barr where he retired, alongside various other employment that supported his mission. His true vocation, however, was within the walls of Pure Gospel Temple in Pine Lawn, where he served with distinction in numerous roles, culminating in his consecration as Bishop in the United Holy Church of America on May 7, 1982. His tenure

as the first District President of the Central Western District was noted for his collaborative efforts with community leaders, law enforcement, and his receipt of numerous accolades, including the prestigious Seal of the Senate from the State of Missouri and the Humanitarian Award.

Under his pastoral leadership, Pure Gospel Temple thrived as a place of “Sowing, Growing, and Glowing,” reflecting his vision for a church that nurtured both the spiritual and natural growth of its members. On July 3, 2010, Bishop Bradford and Pastor Katherine Bradford was given the Divine Favor of God to meet in Milwaukee, WI. After much Prayer and falling deeply in Love, Bishop and Katherine would be joined in Holy Matrimony within 107 days. Since that time Bishop and Pastor Katherine Bradford have continued to work as a “United Force in the Kingdom of GOD, helping to transform lives. In 2019, Pastor Katherine Bradford was installed as his successor, a testament to his forward-thinking leadership.

Bishop Bradford’s legacy is one of love, service, and a steadfast commitment to the gospel. Known as a “Man after God’s own Heart,” he was a proclaimer of the Word with a pastoral experience spanning over 60 years. His influence extended to his role as an affiliated member of the United Holy Church Council of Bishops, the honorary father of Bishops of ECOBAL, and his community engagement, including serving as a Director of the Florissant, Missouri Fire Department and serving with the Police Department.

His message resonated with all who were blessed to encounter him, and he was lovingly called the “PROCLAIMER,” a preacher unashamed of the gospel and prepared for God’s calling. Celebrants at a past birthday reflected on his impact, saying, “I got to celebrate THEE Bishop Bose Bradford!! Oh, what a blessing you have been to many generations.

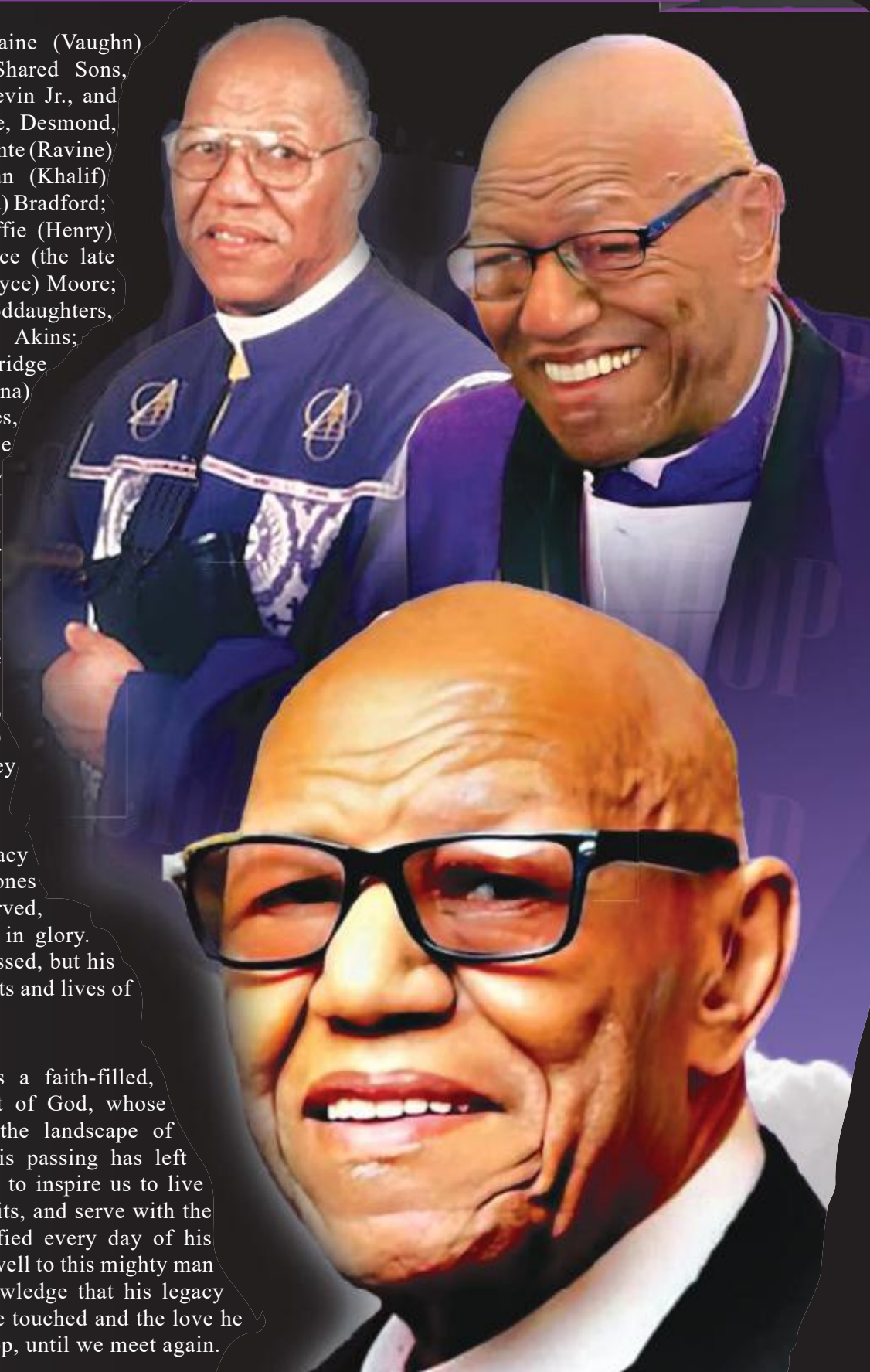
“And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose.” Romans 8:28 was his favorite scripture. Bishop Bose Bradford was a Prolific Preacher, A Husband, A Father, A Grandfather, An Overseer, A Community Activist, and a Friend.

Bishop Bradford leaves to cherish his great memories and legacy, his loving and devoted wife, Pastor Katherine Bradford who he adored and

protected; his Daughter, Elaine (Vaughn) Shivers who he cherished; Shared Sons, Archbishop Devin (Nadine, Devin Jr., and Caleb) Owens, Desmond (Allie, Desmond, Mylasha, Alex) Henley, and Dionte (Ravine) Henley; Granddaughter, Jordan (Khalif) Stevenson; Brother, Sam (Letha) Bradford; Sisters, Mary Bradford and Effie (Henry) Bouie; brothers-in-law, Clarence (the late Lorene) Young and Derrick (Joyce) Moore; Sister-in-law, Delisa Bond; Goddaughters, Oral Lee and Ora Bell Akins; Godsons, Elder Willis Eldridge Wright Sr., and Kelvin (Regina) Baucom; and a host of Nieces, Nephews, Cousins, Friends, The membership of PURE GOSPEL TEMPLE, The United Holy Church of America, Ecobal, where he served as the Father of the Bishops Council and Co-Founder of Lifter of the Head Ministry; Spiritual Daughters, Larita Barnes Rice, Ms. Phebe Hines, and Shauntel Dorsey; and one Special Adjutant who served Bishop in "LIFE AND TRANSITION" Elder Rodney Reavling.

Bishop Bose Bradford's legacy lives on through his loved ones and the communities he served, both in the earthly realm and in glory. His presence will be deeply missed, but his impact will continue in the hearts and lives of those he touched.

Bishop Bose Bradford was a faith-filled, loving, and thoughtful servant of God, whose life's work forever changed the landscape of countless hearts and souls. His passing has left a void, but his spirit continues to inspire us to live with purpose, love without limits, and serve with the same passion that he exemplified every day of his remarkable life. As we bid farewell to this mighty man of God, we rejoice in the knowledge that his legacy will endure through the lives he touched and the love he shared. Rest in glory, My Bishop, until we meet again.



Mother Justine Holder

Justine Holder was born in Buffalo, NY to William Harrison and Ruby Humphrey on March 11, 1932. She departed this life and entered eternal rest on October 31, 2023.

Justine was educated in the Buffalo public school system, graduating from Hutchinson Central in 1950. In 1957, Justine married, Wilbert Bernard Holder, and the two enjoyed loving marital companionship for 60 years until his death in 2017. This union was blessed with two sons: Keith Brian and Kenneth Bernard Holder, and two daughters/nieces: Rev. Kimberly B. Gladden and Gail Gladden Reid.

Justine, or Teena as she was affectionately called, was a gifted artist and attended Erie Community College for graphic arts. She was employed as a lab technician at Pratt & Lambert, and then went on to work as a technician in a Veterinarian Hospital. Her employment journey then took her to Roswell Park as a medical illustrator. She would go on to work at Roswell for 25 years until she retired. In retirement, she worked as a home health care companion until her health declined.



A devoted follower of Christ, she was a legendary and lifelong member of Bethel Tabernacle United Holy Church of America. She enthusiastically gave her time and talent to the church. She accepted Christ at the tender age of 15 during the BCS/YPHA Convention in Roselle, NJ and from that day forward gave dedicated and loyal service wherever she could. Her dedication to the church began as a Secretary to the BCS (Bible Church School) and YPHA. She would go on to serve as a member of the Bethel Tabernacle Choir, as Director of the Youth Church, Choir Director, Musician, Sunday School Teacher, Van Driver, Financial Secretary, a Trustee and ultimately given the official title of "Church Mother."

When not engrossed in the work of the Lord or enjoying quality family time, Justine loved to travel and collect elephant figurines, as well as attending all the great meetings of the United Holy Church of America. Affectionately known by many as "Aunt Teena", she was a mentor and surrogate mother to many young people who prospered from her wisdom and guidance. She also had a great passion for helping seniors. There was no age limit to those who came under her caring embrace, and this brought many saints in the winter of their lives to be able to pass on in comfort and security due to her special care, love, and concern.

Justine was a pillar of strength that many leaned upon. But her dependence was on God, who saw her through many illnesses and kept her for 91 years. To quote her, "When I get to my journey's end, I just want to bear the Lord say, 'Well done thou good and faithful servant.'"

Justine was preceded in death by her beloved siblings: Bernice Thornton Young, Odessa Humphrey Gladden, Robert Eugene Humphrey Sr., James Colbert Sr. and Brenda Humphrey Mount Castle.

She is survived by two loving and faithful sons: Keith Brian and Kenneth Bernard; two brothers: William Harrison Jr. and Brian Humphrey; two nieces/daughters: Rev. Kimberly Gladden and Gail (Isaiah) Reid; a faithful cousin, Beverly Blue; grandson, Andre Lamar

Garcia; three great-grandchildren; cousins, nieces, nephews and many friends.

Elder Brian Keith Grant

Brian Keith Grant was born on March 29, 1968, in Minneapolis, Minnesota, to Roosevelt and Josie Grant, becoming the second child in a family of four siblings, and the first son. Brian was always full of energy and his journey through life was marked by a passion for music, sports, and ministry.

Brian's love for music started with piano and drum lessons. Recognized early for his drumming talent at Lusher Elementary, he was asked to perform the daily drumroll alongside the trumpet's rendition of Taps before his school's pledge of allegiance. In addition to his musical talent, he also displayed exceptional athletic abilities in football, basketball, and track and field throughout school. In football, Brian contributed to the first football state championship in Hazelwood Central High School history. In track and field, he took first place in the state triple jump, clinching the state title for his team. Brian's legacy in athletics is solidified in the Hazelwood Central athletics hall of fame and he holds the school records in the triple jump and 4x100 relay to this day, over 35 years later.

Brian attended Lindenwood University and St. Louis Christian College. While in school, he began his career with United Parcel Service (UPS), where he dedicated 33 years of service. Throughout his tenure at UPS, he worked in various roles including, Truck Preloader, Recruiter, and Human Resources Leader. His commitment to community outreach extended far beyond his professional endeavors. Brian actively collaborated with organizations like Urban League and Job Corps to provide opportunities for those seeking employment and job skills.

Brian was an elder at Christ Holiness Temple and the armor bearer to his pastor, Bishop Gearline Smith. He also sang in the choir, was the lead drummer, served as a Sunday School Teacher, and was chairman of the Trustee Board. His passion for ministry led him to evangelize and preach the gospel across the United States; yet he deeply cared for the souls of the youth at his home church. He had a unique ability to connect with children and young people. His sermons were known for their demonstrations, clarity, and simplicity. His messages typically had 3 points; most often with the third point concluding with a compelling call to praise.

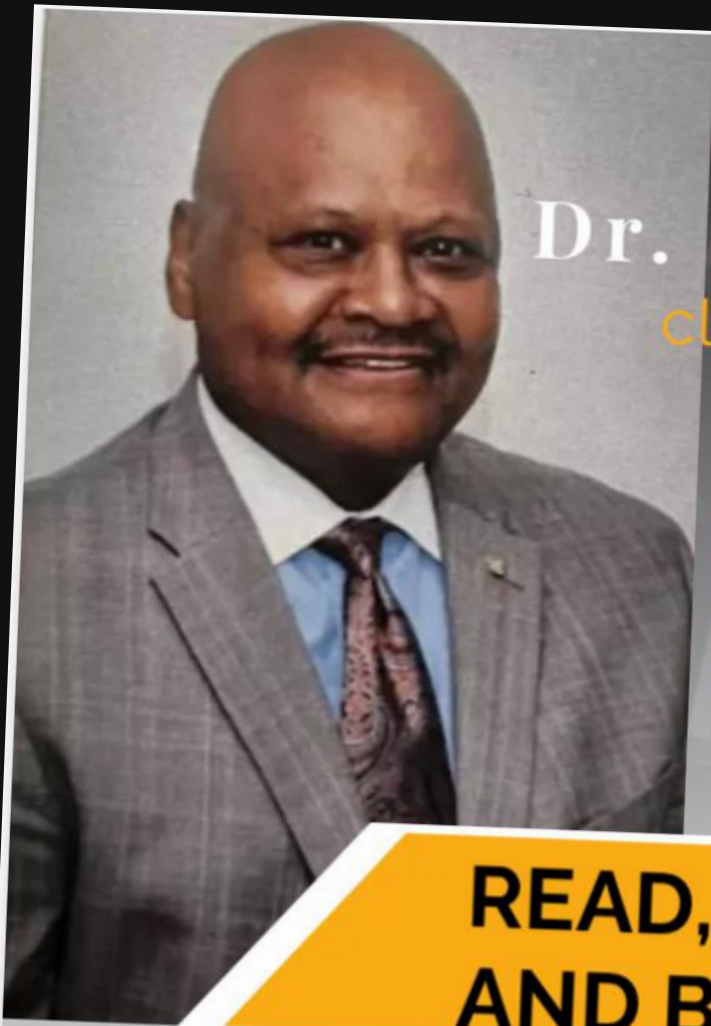
Brian loved gospel music, and played the drums for multiple community, district, and national choirs, including the Gospel Music Workshop of America. During these years, he began teaching songs and choir directing. This ultimately led to his elevation to Minister of Music for the Central Western District of the United Holy Church (UHC), following in the footsteps of his cousin and mentor, Richard (Ricky) Fortson. As Minister of Music, Brian recorded and produced the Central Western District Live CD, fulfilling the vision he shared with Ricky. This was one of his proudest achievements.

Brian has been active in the Central Western District since he was a child—attending annual youth conventions and convocations. He facilitated workshops, led the choir, and preached the word in many meetings. In addition to being the Central Western District Minister of Music, he held leadership roles in the evangelism department. An evangelism highlight was preaching at and supporting the month-long tent revival in Wisconsin.

Brian made friends everywhere he went. Whether he was with family, friends, or strangers; you could be sure that Brian was talking, laughing, and joking with everyone around him. His engaging personality endeared him to all who crossed his path. Brian's legacy will endure as a testament to his boundless energy and genuine love of God and family.

Brian's father, Roosevelt Grant preceded him to glory. Brian leaves to love and cherish his memory, his mother Josie Grant, his sister, Roslyn Grant, his brothers, Tracy Grant (Melissa) and David Grant (Stacie), his nieces and nephews, Teyara Grant, David Grant Jr. (Taya), Kelly Grant, Kamryn Grant, Mia Grant, Joie Grant, Charlie Fike, Melanie Fike; his great nephew, Josiah Grant; his goddaughter, Jahmelia Johnson, his aunt and pastor, Bishop Gearline Smith, his Christ Holiness Temple and Central Western District Families, cousins, friends, and a multitude of cherished memories and lives he touched.

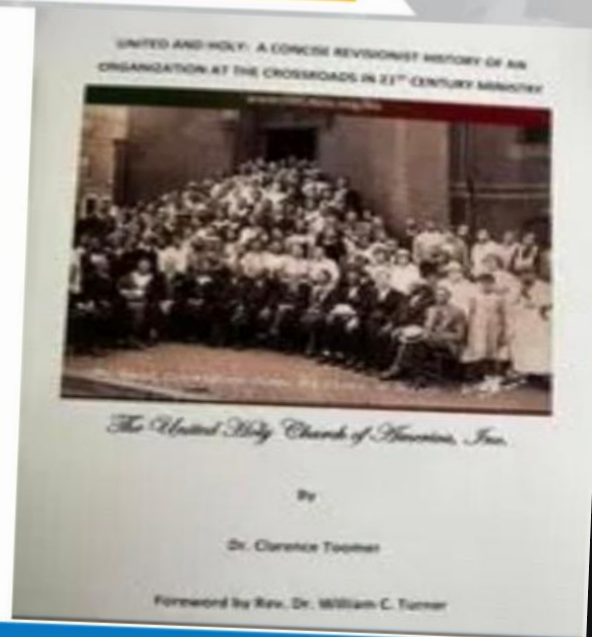
